RATIONALE

Malnutrition is a major public health concern. This includes both over and under-nutrition. Under-nutrition remains a major threat to the survival, growth and development of children. Globally, 165 million children under the age of five are estimated to be stunted and 45% of child deaths are attributable to undernutrition (Global Nutrition Report, 2020). Overnutrition characterized by non-communicable conditions and diseases, is a growing problem in both developed and developing countries (including Kenya). Leading to the triple burden of malnutrition. Yet nutrition is still a neglected area in public health

The setting up and implementation of UHC policies in many developing countries, combined with the increasing interest from UN agencies, SUN Movement and donor(s) towards this approach, represents an important opportunity for nutrition to be part of national health policies.

KNDI has organized their 2nd International Conference in Nutrition and Dietetics between the 17th to the 19th of November 2021, to be held at the Kenya Nutritionists and Dieticians Institute to bring together different professionals and key players of nutrition to discuss & review the role of nutrition in UHC through scientific sharing.
