1.0 OPENING STATEMENT OF THE PROFESSIONAL CONGREGATION

PUBLIC License Award is an innovative venture by Kenya Nutritionists and Dieticians Institute founded on the current institute’s vision. This is a guided process within the mandate as follows:

An Act of Parliament to provide for the training, registration and licensing of nutritionists and dieticians; to provide for the regulation of the standards, and practice of the profession; to ensure their effective participation in matters relating to nutrition and dietetics, and for connected purposes [Act No. 18 of 2007, L.N. 130/2008.]

During this occasion all degree, diploma and certificate graduates from various recognised and/or licensed training institutions (Universities and Colleges) are gathered in one place for the Public to witness their licensure. BSc. Graduates as a prerequisite fulfil the requirements for supervised one-year internship programme and professional examinations for various sub-disciplines (*i.e., Clinical nutrition, clinical dietetics, food service diet therapy, food science nutrition, community nutrition and public health nutrition*) before they are licensed. The diploma graduates as a pre-requisite pass professional examinations in two sub-disciplines (*i.e., Nutrition Technology and Dietetics Technology*) while certificate graduate must pass nutrition and dietetics technicians examination before licensure. In this cohort other specialists in this category include *renal nutritionists* and *paediatric nutritionists*. A professional nutritionist or dietician only qualifies for the above when they are duly indexed during their pre-service training at college or university level.

All the professionals regardless of their levels of training are publicly made to realise the demands of their professional orientation and are tasked to subscribe to professional commitment through *professional oath* as led by the Chairperson of Disciplinary Committee or an advocate of high court who is a member of the Disciplinary Committee by deligation.

2.0 SECTOR-WIDE STATEMENT BY KNDI MANAGEMENT



KENYA Nutritionists and Dieticians Institute (KNDI) is a semi-autonomous legal entity created by a parliamentary statute (*The Nutritionists and Dieticians Act 18, 2007- Cap 253B*). It is currently placed to execute its mandate within the health sector under Executive Order No. 1 of 12th October 2022. The Ministry of Health plays an oversight role to ensure the institute is operational through the gazettelement of Council members. This power is exercised through the office of Cabinet Secretary. The communication channel on matters of oversight with regard to performance is between the office of the Cabinet

secretary and the office of the Chairperson of the Council. The elected Chairperson and Council members draw their powers from professional members. Operational matters and performance reporting for purposes of learning and accountability of the institute may allow the exchange of information between the office of the Principal Secretary of the State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards and the office of the KNDI Chief Executive Officer as aligned by Executive Order No. 1 Of 2022 for H.E The President of the Republic of Kenya Dr. Wiliam S. Ruto.

It is important to report to the professionals and the Public that in the past 15 years, KNDI, being a non-exchequer parliamentary-created membership agency with critical functions, has been funded by professional membership subscriptions and fees from professionals as well as technical support to various institutions, including food companies, training institutions and CPD programmes targeting nutrition and dietetics professionals. Other options available for funding under the Act include consultancy services, grants and donations from relevant bodies with non-conflicting service focus and bank interest from reserve fund proceeds and investment in government security. The institute is proud to report that through the wisdom of the governing pillars, a new resource mobilisation and service arm in the name of ATRI PLC has now picked up its operation in the area of capacity building, community outreaches and partnerships, research and innovation and business incubation. Recently, this entity has initiated collaboration with various institutions on service delivery matters. ATRI PLC is now collaborating through a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with six universities in Kenya (Namely TUK, MKU, Karatina, Pwani, MMUST, and Baraton). Two weeks ago, the ATRI PLC hosted the 3rd symposium on “Mediterranean Diet and Culinary Roots: Health and Tradition” in collaboration with the Italian Embassy and Italian Institute of Culture during the week of Italian Cuisine on 21st November 2024. This provided a platform for public and professional knowledge on matters of food, nutrition and diet. ATRI programmes through the business incubation pillar have begun the journey of strengthening

pre-clinical skills in training by assisting institutions in acquiring state-of-the-art medical training mannequins at a 40 per cent actual market price. The necessity is to ensure integrated teaching of frontline medical health cadre, including nutritionists/dieticians, physicians, clinical officers and nurses, among others. This approach will allow for good communication between health cadres for a common purpose. So far, institutions that acquired such manikins are MKU, Vision Empowerment Training Institute, Kabete National Technical Training Institute, and Nuria Medical College in Wajir. For your information, ATRI programmes are set to establish a nutrition and dietetics TV and nutrition channel as well as nutrition-specific and sensitive telemedicine within the border. Professionals are required to submit expressions of interest to be part of the process.

KNDI is proud to identify with the Ministry of Health and always welcomes good gestures from the office of the Cabinet Secretary, as evidenced by frequent consultations, joint regulatory activities, inspections of health facilities under the Health Act 2017 and oversight appointments in various committees. The current Health Laws (Amendment) Act 2019 makes KNDI among the health regulatory authorities in close work relationships to strengthen ministerial functions in the health sector.

KNDI, however, values independence in operations, with accountability and transparency as the bare minimum in service delivery. The institute urges all service providers in the health sector to observe and respect this independence and use appropriate channels when exchanging official regulatory information. Once again, gratitude goes to the Cabinet Secretary, Dr. Deborah M. Barasa, for the oversight role and support. We also want to thank our Principal Secretary of the State Department for Public Health and Professional Standards for the good business relationship in the Health Sector. We cannot forget to thank the Union-KUNAD, which has taken up the welfare matter for professionals and has been active with the national and county governments. The collaboration with the Nutrition Association of Kenya is evident through the Nutrition Academy and has been useful in training expertise in specialised areas such as paediatric nutrition, renal nutrition, critical care nutrition and oncology nutrition. As seniors (Professionals), your support for the National and County governments is observable.

3.0 ACCREDITATION COMMITTEE STATEMENT

THE Accreditation Committee draws its mandate from the KNDI Act No. 18 of 2007 and Subsequent amendment with the major function to offer professional examinations, prepare Core-curricula guidelines and syllabuses of instructions for training institutions and avail standardised professional examination for persons seeking registration under the Act. To guide the process, KNDI has developed training standards guidelines and 11 standards checklists with sub-indicators and the Examination Policy to guide this process.

Accreditation concerns standards in all spheres of KNDI operations, including training, private practices and food trade/production, which will be reflected in the quality of the products and services offered to clients and Kenya's population. KNDI accreditation standards dovetail very well with the ISO standards and all other standards systems, but they are more specific on nutrition and dietetic matters.

The Accreditation generally shall:

- a) Provide for proper training of persons to be registered and licensed;
- b) prepare syllabuses of instruction and training courses for persons seeking registration under the Act;
- c) prepare and conduct examinations for persons seeking registration under the Act;
- d) charge the appropriate examination fees in consultation with the Council of the Institute;
- e) prepare regulations to be made by the Institute regarding the standard of proficiency to be gained in each examination for a diploma, degree or other award;
- f) develop regulations for internship programmes for students of nutrition and dietetics during pre-service training;
- g) set up quality assurance units to generally carry out broad perspectives of quality management systems;
- h) develop standards for training institutions for purposes of accreditation and licensing;
- i) engage inspectors for various functions of the Committee who shall serve on such terms and conditions as the Council may determine from time to time;
- j) participate actively in the committees of food and drugs authority within the Health Act 2017;
- k) review the appropriateness of documents to be presented for examination, internship, registration and licensing;
- l) spearhead the authenticity and for purposes of systems audits and certification of processes of the Institute;
- m) register and license persons qualified to be registered under this Act;
- n) prepare a list of professionals to be deregistered by the Institute in accordance with this Act;

- o) keep a register of all registered members;
- p) keep a register of all licensed and retained professionals and
- q) carry out the indexing of students enrolled in various institutions and monitor their progression.

4.0 DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE STATEMENT

THE Disciplinary Committee is an independent Committee charged for receiving and investigating complaints against practitioners in accordance with the rules and regulations under "The Nutritionists and Dieticians Act"

- 1) The Disciplinary Committee may order the removal from the register, suspension of registration or revocation of the practising license of a practitioner or the imposition of a fine on a practitioner as may be prescribed by the Council if that practitioner: -
 - (a) Has been convicted of an offence punishable by imprisonment, the commission which in the opinion of the Institute has dishonoured him in the public estimation;
 - (b) Has been guilty of negligence or malpractice regarding his profession.
 - (c) Has been guilty of impropriety or misconduct, whether concerning his profession or not.
- 2) Upon an inquiry held by the committee, the person whose conduct is being inquired into shall be allowed to be heard in person or through an advocate.
- 3) For the purposes of proceedings at any inquiry held by the disciplinary committee, the committee may administer oaths and, subject to any regulation made under the Act, enforce the attendance of persons as witnesses and the production of books and documents.
- 4) Any person whose name has been removed from the register or whose license has been suspended shall forthwith surrender to the Institute his certificate of registration or license, and any person who fails to do so commits to an offence.
- 5) Any person aggrieved by the committee's decision may appeal to the High Court within 14 days of the decision's date.

All professionals must read cap 253 B for finer details and be advised accordingly. So far, we have not recorded any disciplinary cases, and we congratulate the professionals for putting professionalism at the top.

5.0 OFFICIAL GOVERNANCE REMARKS



KNDI Council is the governing (Annex 1a) body of the Kenya Nutritionists and Dieticians Institute, which was established under Section 4 of the *Nutritionists and Dieticians Act, 18, 2007*. This role is accomplished through the office of the CEO and secretariat (Annex 1c) as directed by various approved policies and guidelines developed within the legal framework.

The functions of the Council are:

1. Determine and set the framework for the professional practice of nutritionists and dieticians.
2. Set and enforce standards of professional practice and ethics on nutrition and dietetics;
3. Enforce a program of quality assurance for the nutrition and dietetics profession
4. Approve institutions for the purpose of training persons seeking registration under this Act;
5. Research into and provide public education on nutrition and dietetics
6. Maintain the competence of members by updating their knowledge through publications and the conduct of continuing professional education;
7. Provide training for nutritionists and dieticians;
8. Design programs and methods for sensitisation on suitable dietary and nutritional habits and
9. Working jointly with other bodies, participate actively in reviews of food, food supplements and fortifiers with nutrient claims.
10. Perform such other functions as may be necessary for proper administration of the Act.

The Council is continuing to realise its core mandate adopted and continue developing policies and guiding tools for the proper execution of its mandate. To date, the new Council building from the previous Council has: -

1. Developed regulations to implement the Nutritionists and Dieticians Act, 18, 2007.
2. Establish a Register of all persons trained in Nutrition and/or Dietetics and a database for retained compliant professionals.
3. Approved training institutions offering courses in Nutrition and Dietetics through rigorous site inspection of their facilities based on 11 indicator checklists annexed to training standards.
4. Developed the minimum core curriculum to be used in training Nutritionists and Dieticians at Certificate, Diploma and Degree levels.

5. Developed a system of indexing all students enrolled in nutrition and dietetics courses in colleges and universities guided by indexing guidelines.
6. Prepared guidelines for Internships for new graduates to align their practical competencies for one year before registration and professional licensing in line with the Act.
7. Developed a programme for Continuing Professional Development (CPD) to ensure members keep themselves updated with new developments in the field guided by CPD guidelines.
8. Developed a code of ethics for nutrition and dietetics professionals
9. Developed a Communications Policy document.
10. Developed Resource Mobilization policy.
11. Developed Reserve Fund Policy.
12. Developed Examination Policy.
13. Developed Standard Operating Procedures for various business processes.
14. Instituted a Journal of Nutrition and Dietetics (ISSN 2415-5195) as a platform for scientific writing and exchange in line with function no. 5.
15. Instituted a functional organogram and effective secretariat led by the able Chief Executive Officer to operationalise all the policies and guidelines.
16. Continuously improved regulatory framework by initiating successful amendments for the Nutritionists and Dieticians Act, 18, 2007 within the Health Laws (Amendment) Act, May 2019.
17. Setting up ATRI PLC as a service and resource mobilisation arm of KNDI.
18. Nutrition and Dietetics Professional Qualification and Competency Certification Policies
19. Remuneration policy
20. Approved fees for all services
