RE: LICENCE RENEWAL BASED ON CPD

The mandate of the Kenya Nutritionists and Dieticians Institute (KNDI) is to provide for training, registration and licensing of nutritionists and dieticians; to regulate the standards and practices in the profession; and ensure effective participation of all stakeholders in matters related to nutrition and dietetics. CPD helps nutritionists and dieticians to keep abreast of the new developments in promotive, preventive and curative nutrition and health care services, as well as ensure continued learning and updating of knowledge, skills and attitudes.

KNDI wishes to inform all its professionals that starting 2020/2021 financial year, all nutritionists and dieticians will be required to attain a minimum of 14 CPD points (equivalent to 42 hours) per calendar year to qualify for re-licensure and retention in the register of nutritionists and dieticians maintained by KNDI. Evidence of the CPD activities should be uploaded on the KNDI system, the complete list of CPD activities and points together with accredited CPD providers can be obtained from KNDI website (www.kndi.institute).
